ADMISSIBILITY

Student must already be accepted into a Bachelor of Education program with French as a teachable.

Students who have already started or completed at least one semester of their education degree will not be considered. The bursary is limited to students enrolled in an Education program in Nova Scotia, New Brunswick, Newfoundland and Labrador, and Prince Edward Island.

One bursary will be available for each of the following post-secondary institutions:

- Université Sainte-Anne
- Acadia University
- Mount Saint Vincent University
- Saint Francis Xavier University
- Memorial University
- University of PEI
- Université de Moncton

Students will need to submit an 800-word essay, or a 3-minute video, as well as the supporting documents requested.
